1. Introduction

The aim of this module is to build upon the Creative Scaffolding 1 module for a second trimester within the Studio+ year.

The module offers a blend of school-wide and department-specific skills training to help equip students with the professional, making and digital skills required by industry. The module forms part of the Studio+ suite of modules, which seek to give Design students at NCAD a sense of independence and professionalism as they work collaboratively with each other, and with external organisations.

The module is intended to support students undertaking the Design Bureau Minor and Major modules, where students address real world projects and undertake research projects.

The module is underpinned by lectures, seminars and workshops.

2. What will I learn?

On successful completion of the module, students will be able to:

- 1. DEVELOP: demonstrate the ability to further develop a range of professional skills required within their discipline and the wider creative industries.
- 2. APPLY: demonstrate the ability to critically apply a range of professional skills to resolve real world design projects.

3. How will I learn?

Students will learn through a combination of set activities within the studio and self-directed study within and outside the studio and workshops.
