1. Introduction

This module will enable learners to work on a self-selected and generated project, undertaking a wide-ranging and in-depth practical and theoretical investigation into your chosen discipline/field of practice.

Students will be supported to execute projects from both a pragmatic and speculative perspective, demonstrating their ability to prepare and present their work in a variety of contexts and formats both for the purposes of assessment and for the wider dissemination and promotion of their practice to peers, public and a professional audience.

This module aims to:

- Promote the development of written communication skills (project proposals/ reflective evaluation), oral communication skills (presentation/ group debate) and problem based learning.
- Develop students ability to identify a subject or issue within a professional, social and cultural context for applying design research.
- Develop students ability to determine if a project proposal is feasible within an academic and professional context.

2. What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

1. EXPLORE: Demonstrate independent initiative and self-critical application of original ideas.
2. DEVELOP: Demonstrate a fully integrated, critical and contextualised relationship between creative practice and research.

3. SYNTHESISE: Generate, evaluate and consolidate original research within the production of realised projects.

Students will learn through a combination of set activities within the studio and self-directed study within and outside the studio.
