## 1. Introduction

This module is designed to introduce students to the practices and principles involved in assessing the success of service solutions, using a mixed method approach. During this module, students will respond to a design brief by undertaking user-centred research, establishing a benchmark for the current user experience, analysing and synthesising findings, and identifying actionable insights for further exploration. Students will then create a range of service concepts, and generate low medium fidelity experience prototypes that can be evaluated with project stakeholders. Students will refine their ability to communicate service design concepts and processes visually and orally at a professional standard, preparing them for effective stakeholder engagement. Throughout the module students will participate in lectures and workshop activities to equip them with a range of contemporary methods and tools associated with qualitative and quantitative evaluation of service solutions.

#### 2. What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

- Respond to a project brief
- Work in a self-directed manner and within a team in a problem-oriented, project-oriented and interdisciplinary way
- Work with industry and other stakeholders in the development and delivery of projects
- Demonstrate knowledge in the theory and practice of service design
- Demonstrate knowledge of user-centred design and the ability to involve the user in the design process; from ethnographic user studies to evaluation of prototypes and final products
- Conduct, analyse and synthesise both primary and secondary research

- Respond to and incorporate research findings and insights in service design projects
- Apply methodologies and techniques in the design, development, prototyping and evaluation of services
- Demonstrate a comprehensive process for solving complicated, multi-faceted problems of design
- Disseminate and communicate visually and orally at an appropriate professional standard

## 9. How will I have the chance to evaluate the module?
